 Division Plan for Continuous Growth over the next 3 Years.

- We have a PD day scheduled for Jan. 29. We haven't yet rescheduled the day we lost. Two half days= 1 PD day


Considerations: Based on some of the discussions from our last meeting

1. We have received a substantial amount of support through grants from the Edmonton Catholic Schools Foundation DreamMaker Fund. So far they have given us \$2150 to cover our Wellness dog visits this year. In addition another \$1000.00 for our grade 2 and 6 Telus Coding field trip.

- Last year we fundraised for the Foundation with our "Best Seats in the House" Christmas Concert ticket sales. It did conflict with SAC fundraising of 50/50 & Poinsettia Sales- and so we will not be doing a fundraiser at this time.
