
# Parent Week At A Glance May 18-24, 2025

### Mary, Mother of God: A Guiding Light for Catholic Education

The month of May holds a special place in the hearts of Catholic Christians around the world, recognized in the Church's liturgical calendar as a time of profound devotion to Mary, the Mother of God. Within the Edmonton Catholic School Division, this month takes on added significance. Mary is not only our spiritual mother - she is also our patron saint, a guiding presence who walks with us in faith, formation, and education.

Mary's role in the life of the Church is both foundational and inspirational. She is revered not only as the mother of Jesus but also as the first disciple and evangelizer. Her life was a continual affirmation of faith - a steady, resounding "yes" to God. This unwavering trust is perhaps most beautifully revealed in the story of the Visitation. Rather than proclaiming the Good News with grand speeches, Mary offers her testimony through presence - by carrying Christ within her and sharing that quiet, powerful witness with her cousin Elizabeth.

While Scripture preserves only a few of Mary's words, her impact on salvation history is profound. From the moment of the Annunciation to her presence at the foot of the Cross and beyond, Mary accompanied Jesus through every stage of His earthly mission. Her life was a journey of surrender and transformation, defined by love and sustained by faith. Through her openness to God's will, Mary became a vessel of divine grace, shaping the course of history through humble obedience.

The early Church recognized this profound role and honored her with the title *Theotokos* - a Greek term meaning "God-Bearer" or "Mother of God." This title, officially affirmed at the Council of Ephesus in 431 A.D., upholds the Church's core belief in Jesus Christ as fully divine and fully human. Today, *Theotokos* remains a central expression of Marian devotion in both Eastern and Western traditions, reminding us that by drawing close to Mary, we are led ever more deeply into the mystery of her Son.

In Catholic education, Mary continues to be a model of discipleship, compassion, and wisdom. Her example calls us to nurture not only minds but hearts, to encourage faith alongside knowledge, and to journey together in a spirit of grace and humility. As we honor Mary throughout the month of May, we recommit ourselves to her example - one of steadfast faith, selfless love, and a willingness to let God's plan unfold through us.

May Mary, Mother of God and patron of our schools, continue to guide us in all we do, helping us to grow as learners, believers, and disciples of Christ.

#### Bug Spray and Sunscreen



#### Alberta Health Services recommendations:

 Prolonged exposure to bug spray is not recommended for elementary-age children.

#### We suggest:


- Parents send long pants and long-sleeved
  jackets with their child as it is much better for students to cover up when
  they are outside, rather than using bug spray.
- The peak eating times for mosquitoes are dawn and dusk and these times are not during school hours, so by covering up, children should be okay outside.
- Staff members will not be spraying insect repellent or applying sunscreen on students.
- Parents who choose to send insect repellent with their children, please be advised that for safety precautions, this insect repellent is not to be shared with other students.
- Insect repellent should also only be sprayed outside, away from other students.

#### SUPERVISION REMINDERS/ Morning Drop off/ Afterschool Playground

Just a reminder that there are no teacher supervisors on the playground before or afterschool. If you are dropping off your child and will not be supervising them, we ask that you send them to the back of the school where the supervisors are located.

In addition, Baturyn School's lunch recess overlaps with our early dismissal on Thursdays. This has caused some issues at the park. Baturyn teachers are out to supervise their students and many of our students are going to the park to play unsupervised. For safety, we ask parents to speak to their child about going home after school if they are without a parent to supervise them.
