
Parent Week At A Glance October 28 -November 1, 2024



Halloween Treat Collection

This year at St. Charles, we are encouraging students who go out trick or treating to bring back one or more Halloween treats for Edmonton's inner-city community. We will be collecting Halloween treats from Nov. 4-7. All treats collected will be delivered to people outside of shelters in Edmonton's inner city. If each student at St. Charles donates one Halloween treat, we will have 350 treats to share!



Sunday, November 17th is the 8th annual World Day of the Poor. Sacred Heart Parish will organize an outreach event targeted at reaching approximately 350 of our city's most vulnerable and unhoused men and women. Each year, the Parish plans a warm meal to serve and also distributes clothing and toiletry essentials. They also create care packages that are delivered to those men and women that cannot make it to the church. This year's event is planned for November 16th .

The Grade two's are leading this initiative. Your child will be bringing home a note, "World Day of the Poor" asking for specific items. We will be collecting from October 21-31. Here is the list of items assigned to each class (All adult sizes please):

Volunteers at St. Charles-

All people wishing to volunteer with us will need to complete a **volunteer form** for the year. Some parents will require a police record check (PIC) and child welfare check (IRC) if they are going on field trips or working with students. Please provide your child's teacher with your email address and interest in volunteering.

Police Information checks for volunteers, ages 18 and above, can be obtained free of charge directly from Edmonton Police Services, with a voucher which is provided by our Division.

The voucher must be **used within 1 week of obtaining** it. Please check your junk mail if you haven't received it.

Some field trip volunteers may also require an IRC to be completed, which is free.

Please contact your local Children's Services office or email <u>CS-IRCrequest@gov.ab.ca</u> for a blank form.

Please note that the clearance is valid for one year from the date it was issued. Once you have received your documents, please send them to the office.
