



Principal Report January 7 2026

Happy New Year to everyone and Merry Christmas to our Ukrainian families!

Highlights since our last meeting:

- Students enjoyed an exciting performance of Pinocchio by Alberta Musical Theatre.
- We had great feedback from both parents and teachers on the Parent Teacher Interviews we held in November. We look forward to our Demonstration of Learning on March 5th. This is also our Open House day.
- The COSC (Community of School Councils) evening held at Lumen Christi on November 18 was a huge success. Our Chief Superintendent, Lynette Anderson and Trustee Palazzo highlighted the importance of gathering feedback on the values and priorities we want to see in our schools. The information collected through this engagement evening, surveys and school councils set the direction for the next 3 year Division Plan for Continuous Growth. The evening engaged principals and parents in understanding and exploring the priorities of Catholic Identity, Optimal Learning conditions for all students, Student wellbeing, and Classroom Complexities. Following detailed presentations from various departments, parents were given the opportunity to share their experience within their own school context.
- December was filled with beautiful daily Advent reflections, which concluded with two amazing Christmas Concert evenings. Despite the very cold temperatures, the joy in our students' voices filled our St. Charles Parish with warmth and love of the Christmas season.
- In the spirit of giving our students and families supported two important organizations. Led by our Grade 4B class, who in our December Assembly taught us about charity, donations were collected for the Stollery Children's Hospital. The total amount collected was \$1064.20. We also accepted donations at our concerts in support of Catholic Social Services- Sign of Hope Campaign and raised \$782.60
- All this, in addition to a cereal drive to support Anne Fitzgerald school, socks, mittens, toques and treats for the homeless, and other service projects

completed since our St. Charles Faith Day, truly demonstrates the lived mission statement of our school.

Looking Ahead: Focus on Instruction

- Update on enrollment- We have welcomed several new students and families who have recently moved into our area, which puts our **enrollment at 357**.

- We also continue to engage in professional development in the area of mathematics, assessment, social emotional learning and collaborative response.
- Last year we revised our mission statement, this year we will do the work of revising our vision statement.
- Staff Changes/ Updates- Mrs. Gale is back in Grade 4B, but we are keeping Mrs. Magee who will be supporting students with math intervention in addition to teaching the grade 4 students math in the combined class.
- Our upcoming PD day is Thursday January 29. There will be no class for students.
- Our School Growth Plan review was posted just before Christmas Break and is available to view on our website. You can also see the results from last year's survey results. As a staff we use the results to help us identify areas of growth and help us shape our school growth plan.
