






We will continue to offer Hot Lunch through Healthy Hunger for the 2025/2026 school year on the first Friday of each month.

#### Volunteers at St. Charles for 2025/2026

All people wishing to volunteer with us will need to complete a **volunteer form** for the year. Some parents will require a **Police Record Check (PIC) and child welfare check (IRC)** if they are going on field trips or working with students. Please provide the office with your email address and interest in volunteering.

Police Information checks for volunteers, ages 18 and above, can be obtained free of charge directly from Edmonton Police Services, with a voucher which is provided by our Division. The voucher must be used within 1 week of obtaining it. Please check your junk mail if you haven't received it. Some field trip volunteers may also require an IRC to be completed, which is free.

Please note that the clearance is valid for one year from the date it was issued. Once you have received your documents, please send them to the office.

#### Air Quality During School Hours

The following table provides the health messages for 'at risk' individuals and the general public for each of the <u>AQHI</u> Health Risk Categories.

Air Quality Health Health Risk Index		Health Messages		
	At Risk Population*	General Population		
Low	1 - 3	Enjoy your usual outdoor activities.	Ideal air quality for outdoor activities.	
Moderate	4 - 6	<b>Consider reducing</b> or rescheduling strenuous activities outdoors if you are experiencing symptoms.	No need to modify your usual outdoor activities unless you experience symptoms such as coughing and throat irritation.	
High	7 - 10	Reduce or reschedule strenuous activities outdoors. Children and the elderly should also take it easy.	Consider reducing or rescheduling strenuous activities outdoors if you experience symptoms such as coughing and throat irritation.	
Very High	Above 10	Avoid strenuous activities outdoors. Children and the elderly should also avoid outdoor physical exertion.	<b>Reduce</b> or reschedule strenuous activities outdoors, especially if you experience symptoms such as coughing and throat irritation.	

<sup>\*</sup> People with heart or breathing problems are at greater risk. Follow your doctor's usual advice about exercising and managing your condition.

#### Bug Spray and Sunscreen

#### Alberta Health Services recommendations:

 Prolonged exposure to bug spray is not recommended for elementary-age children.



#### We suggest:

- Parents send long pants and long-sleeved jackets with their child as it is much better for students to cover up when they are outside, rather than using bug spray.
- The peak eating times for mosquitoes are dawn and dusk and these times are not during school hours, so by covering up, children should be okay outside.
- Staff members will not be spraying insect repellent or applying sunscreen on students.
- Parents who choose to send insect repellent with their children, please be advised that for safety precautions, this insect repellent is not to be shared with other students.
- Insect repellent should also only be sprayed outside, away from other students.

## SUPERVISION REMINDERS/ Morning Drop off/ Afterschool Playground

Just a reminder that there are **no teacher supervisors on the playground before or afterschool.** If you are dropping off your child and will not be supervising them, we ask that you send them to the back of the school where the supervisors are located.

In addition, **Baturyn School's lunch recess overlaps with our early dismissal on Thursdays**. This has caused some issues at the park. Baturyn teachers are out to supervise their students and many of our students are going to the park to play unsupervised. For safety, we ask parents to speak to their child about going home after school if they are without a parent to supervise them.
